THE MAESTRO

It's a new era with Artistic Director & Conductor Brett Mitchell!

Hailed for presenting engaging, in-depth explorations of thoughtfully curated programs, American conductor Brett Mitchell is in consistent



demand on the podium at home and abroad.
Recent engagements have included appearances with the Dallas, Detroit, Houston, Milwaukee, National, Oregon, San Antonio and San Francisco symphonies; the Los Angeles Philharmonic at the Hollywood Bowl; the Cleveland and Minnesota orchestras; and a tour with

the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra. Mr. Mitchell also regularly collaborates with the world's leading soloists, including Yo-Yo Ma, Renée Fleming, Itzhak Perlman, James Ehnes, and Alisa Weilerstein.

Currently an Artistic Partner with the Pasadena Symphony, Mr. Mitchell served as Music Director of the Colorado Symphony in Denver from 2017-2021, deepening the orchestra's engagement with its audience and spearheading collaborations and commissions. In summarizing his tenure, The Denver Post wrote that "Mitchell has been a bright and engaging presence over the years, delving into the history of certain well-worn pieces while leading expert renditions of them."

From 2013 to 2017, Mr. Mitchell served on the conducting staff of The Cleveland Orchestra, leading the orchestra in several dozen concerts each season at Severance Hall and on tour.

From 2007 to 2011, Mr. Mitchell led over 100 performances as Assistant Conductor of the Houston Symphony. He also held Assistant Conductor posts with the Orchestre National de France, working under Kurt Masur. In 2015, Mr. Mitchell completed a highly successful five-year appointment as Music Director of the Saginaw Bay Symphony Orchestra, where an increased focus on locally relevant programming and community collaborations resulted in record attendance.

In addition to his work with professional orchestras, Mr. Mitchell is also well known for mentoring young musicians. His tenure as Music Director of the Cleveland Orchestra Youth from 2013 to 2017 was highly praised, and he is regularly invited to work with the talented young musicians at the Cleveland Institute of Music, the National Repertory Orchestra, and Interlochen Center for the Arts. He has also served on the music faculties at Northern Illinois University, the University of Houston, and the University of Denver.

Born in Seattle, Mr. Mitchell holds degrees in conducting from the University of Texas at Austin and composition from Western Washington University. He also studied with Leonard Slatkin at the National Conducting Institute, was selected by Kurt Masur as a recipient of the inaugural American Friends of the Mendelssohn Foundation Scholarship, and was one of five recipients of the League of American Orchestras' American Conducting Fellowship.
